

## REPORT OF FACTUAL FINDINGS

## To the Trustees of Discovery Health Medical Scheme

We have performed the procedures agreed with you and enumerated below in respect of the counting of the ballot papers for the transfer of business and amalgamation of Nampak SA Medical Scheme into Discovery Health Medical Scheme set forth in the accompanying schedules as well as the two motions submitted by members of the scheme regarding an analysis of the administration fees payable to the Administrator for services rendered and a targeted reduction of the administration fees payable to the Administrator for services rendered. Our engagement was undertaken in accordance with the International Standard on Related Services applicable to agreed-upon procedures engagements.

The procedures were performed solely to assist you in determining the outcome of the voting process and are summarised as follows:

- Membership numbers as stated on the ballot papers were verified for validity by tracing them to the membership system to ensure that only valid and active members voted.
- 2. Only valid votes were counted. A vote was valid if:
  - a. The ballot sheet was signed and dated by the member,
  - b. The ballot sheet was signed and dated by the member;
  - c. Only one option (i.e. vote for / against) was marked on the ballot sheet;
  - d. The membership number was a valid member of DHMS as at 21 June 2012.
  - e. The number of proxies indicated on the ballot paper was compared to the original proxy forms and if in agreement and valid, were counted as valid votes.
- 3. Only valid proxies were counted. A proxy was valid if:
  - a. The name, surname, membership number appeared on the proxy form;
  - b. The proxy form was signed and dated by the member;
  - c. The membership number of the person who gave the proxy was a valid member of DHMS as at 21 June 2012.

1. The votes were counted and the results were as follows:
